Course Name: Planetary Health in Nagasaki

Course Information: In the uniquely geographical, historical, and cultural context of Nagasaki, Japan, we deeply explore various aspects including people's lifestyles, beliefs, efforts towards peace, biodiversity, local communities, traditional crops, and food culture through lectures and guided tours. Throughout the program, we investigate the impact of the international movement of people and goods on local communities' lives and cultures, gaining insights into contemporary societal challenges such as immigration issues, religious conflicts, environmental degradation, and ways to address them.

●Course Period: August 19 (Monday) – August 30 (Friday)

2. Participation Requirements

- I) You must be enrolled in a foreign (non-Japanese) university or graduate school program.
- II) You must enroll in international travel insurance that covers you for the entirety of the course period.
- III) You acknowledge that you are responsible for your airfare, travel costs while in Japan, international travel insurance fees, food, and other costs that may be incurred.

3. Program Fees

Program fees differ based on course:

- Course 1 : 270,000 yen (includes course fees, lodging (15 days), and textbook fees)
- Course 2 : 70,000 yen (includes lodging (6days), transportation fees during on-island program, and food)
- Course 3 : 100,000 yen (includes, lodging (13 days), entrance fees, and transportation fees)

- V) Proof of enrollment in travel insurance (if you do not submit after your acceptance into the program, you will be unable to participate)

5. Results of Application

·Application results will be sent on May 24 (Japan Time) to the person in charge of mobilities at your university.

The number of applications may affect selection; if the numbers of applicants exceeds the number of spots, we will prioritize affiliate universities.

6. Payment of Program Fees

On May 24 we will send an e-mail regarding the participation decision and the payment of participation fees.

Please submit payment by May 31 (credit card).
